





• **Bounce Checks**

If you bounce even one check, you could be denied a checking account at a new bank. Most banks report bounced checks to the interbank services ChexSystems. If you later apply for a new account at another bank that uses ChexSystems, it may refuse you for up to five years. Common sense dictates: don't write a check when you don't have sufficient funds in your account or to try to play the float by hoping that your pay check will be deposited before the check hit your bank for payment. Also, balancing your checking account every time you receive your bank statement will ensure you know how much money you have in the account. But, for your own self-defense, set up overdraft protection with your bank to ensure all checks clear. This will help you avoid the embarrassment, hassle and costs associated with bounced checks.


