Ueno Zoo and Park

Sunday, 9 March
\$5 (Bus transportation only)
Depart: 8:30 am •Return: 6 pm



Ueno Zoo came into being in 1880 and was the first zoological garden in Japan. The zoo has approximately 6 million visitors each year. At present, the zoo exhibits over 2,000 rare and exotic animals, such as the Giant Panda, that were born here in Japan. The grounds are dotted with facilities that tell of its history and cover a total area of roughly 2,741 acres! The Tokyo National Museum is one of the most important structures in the park. There is also the National Science Museum and the Ueno Aquarium, two places not to be overlooked! The aquarium has more than 500 species of fish exhibited on four floors. *Bring yen for admissions, souvenirs and lunch (or feel free to bring lunch).*

Tagata Fertility Festival

It's time for the biggest and best festival of them all...the annual Tagata Fertility Festival on the outskirts of Nagoya. The large crowd normally attending the festival (over 100,000) is expected. If you haven't been on this one...well, you just haven't been! The two major shrines of interest are the male shrine and the female shrine, which requires a short bus ride. We'll take you to the female shrine first. The grand finale is the parade of the male shrine. The folks at home won't believe this one, so be sure to bring your camera and lots of film! Every year we have to turn many individuals away because all available seats have been reserved. Book a seat early! Because of the nature of the festival, this is an adults only tour (18 or older). *Bring yen for souvenirs and lunch (or feel free to bring lunch).*



Watch the "yokozuna" (grand champion) Musashimaru, the "ozeki" (senior champion) Musoyama, the "maegashiras" (amateurs) Dejima, Miyabiyama, Wakanoyama, Buyuuzan and others prepare for the upcoming "Gogatsubasho" (May sumo tournament) in Tokyo. **You must be 13 or older to attend this tour. Bring yen for souvenirs and breakfast.*
