Yokohama Sankeien Garden & Chinatown

Sankei-en Garden is located in **Yokohama** and was founded by Mr. Tomitaro Hara and opened in 1906. The Education Ministry of Japan has deemed the garden as a national treasure that features an extraordinary variety of vegetation, a three-story pagoda, elegant, antique homes and teahouses. The autumn season features some of **Kanagawa** Prefecture's finest chrysanthemums. Next visit **Chinatown**, crammed with hundreds of shops, restaurants and street vendors you'll surely find something of interest. *Bring yen for shopping, souvenirs and food/drinks.*

Hakone Excursion

Experience **Hakone**, a lovely national park that thoroughly combines its ancient history with its natural surroundings. Visit the colorful **Hakone Shrine** that was erected in 757 AD (Approximately) and has been designated as an Important Cultural Property and the **Old Hakone Check Point** that was originally established in 1681 by the Tokugawa Shogunate for the defense of Edo (Tokyo) to control and regulate travelers. Afterwards, view extraordinary surrounding scenery while taking a ropeway. Finally, visit **Owakudani** (valley of great boiling) with its plumes of sulfurous steam gushing from ground. *Bring yen for souvenirs and food/drinks (or feel free to bring your own food/drinks).*

Historic Kamakura

Kamakura is a beautiful seaside town that attracts many visitors each year because of its history, which is considered by most to be a romantic blend of fact and fiction. You are sure to find great pleasure experiencing this beautiful town with its 65 Buddhist temples and 19 Shinto shrines. The **Great Buddha** is the single most visited attraction in Kamakura. Its pose and position of the hands represents the Buddhist symbolism of unwavering faith. Other things of interest that may be seen on this tour are the famous **Hase Kannon** and **Hachimangu Shrine**. The history of Kamakura really began when for the first time in Japan's history, the seat of power was geographically and structurally removed from the **Yamato Region** (Kyoto/Nara area). In the 12th century, the Taira and the Minamoto clans battled for control of Japan. The Taira clan won the war and shortly thereafter killed the Minamoto chief but spared his son, Yoritomo. After living the life of a monk, Yoritomo successfully organized support against the Taira clan, thus avenging his father's death. The war between the two clans continued but ultimately the Minamoto clan secured supreme power over the country. Wishing to distance himself from the rich and stately court life previously favored by those in power he chose Kamakura as his home base. *Bring yen for souvenirs and food/drinks (or feel free to bring your own food/drinks).*



A service fee will be charged for cancellations made less than 72 hours prior to the start of the contract/trip unless documentation from doctor or duty requirement is presented to management. Vehicle Rental Program

Policies

Active duty, retired military with SOFA status, DoD civilians, and their family members at least 20 years of age are authorized to rent vehicles. Individuals renting vehicles must possess a valid U.S. Forces, Japan Operator's Permit for Civilian Vehicles (USFJ Form 4EJ). The Vehicle Rental Office, which is located in bldg. 719 on Camp Zama, offers eight-passenger vans, 1.5 ton covered trucks, and cargo vans.

Late Fee:

A late fee of \$100 will be charged (per day) in addition to the regular rental fee for any vehicle returned 30 minutes after the return time on the rental agreement.

Cancellations:

Cancellations made less than 72 hours in advance will not be refunded.

Time Frame:

Vehicles are rented on a 24 hour = 1 day period.

Fuel:

All vehicles are provided with a full tank of fuel. You have the option of either filling the vehicle prior to returning it, or we can fill it and add the charges to your final bill.

The reservation policy is as follows:

- Vehicles are rented on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Make your reservations early! Our vehicles are in high demand especially on long weekends.
- Vehicle reservations can be made by using Mastercard, Visa, Discover or American Express credit cards, cash or personal check. Payment in advance of actual rental period is required.
